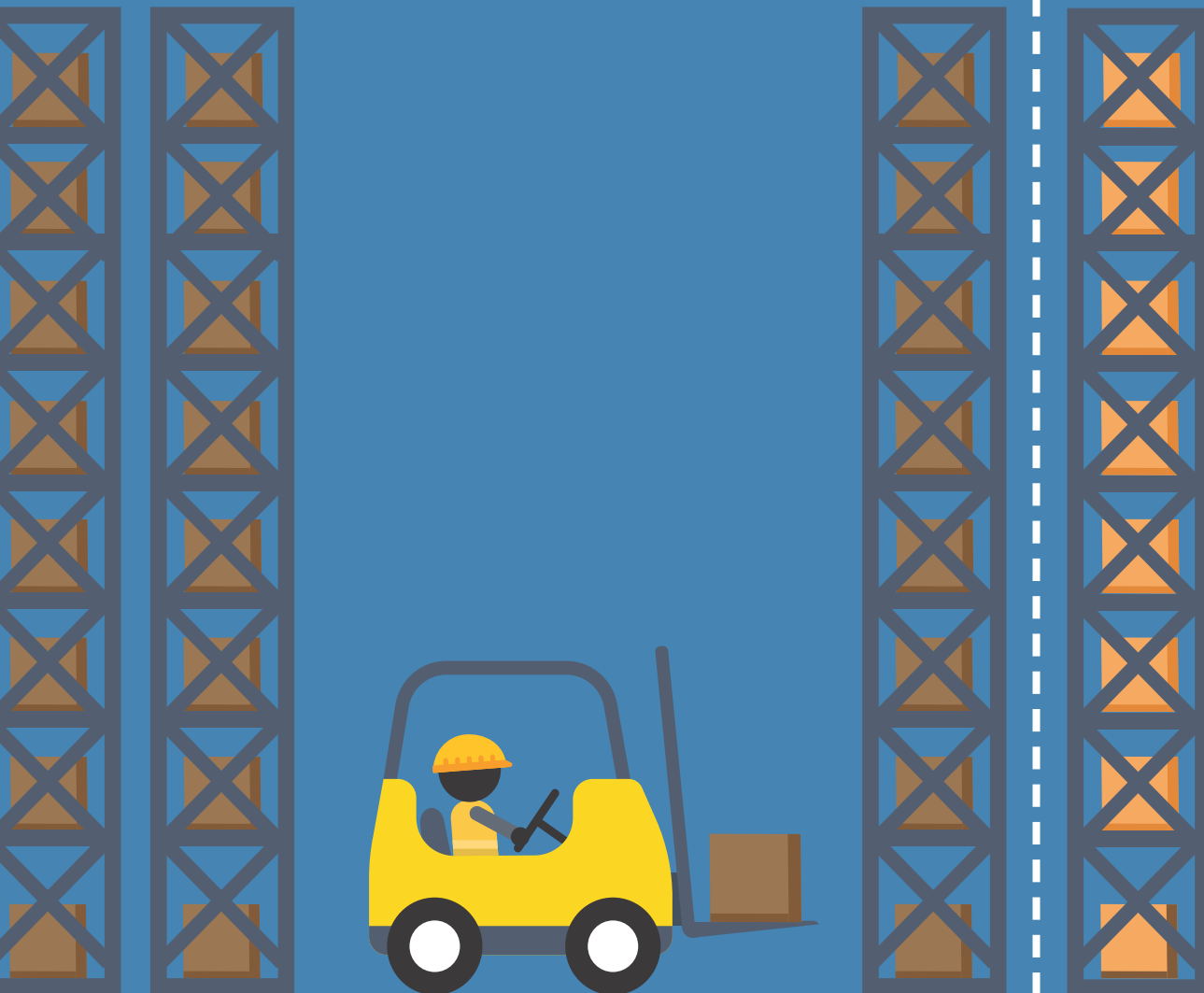




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# Maximise warehouse storage space the easy way!

### Planning for Warehouse Storage Efficiency

The segregation of warehouse space into contained smaller environments, all within the same location is becoming increasingly common.

Common reasons for this requirement include:

- Enabling different types of goods to be stored directly next to each other, without the risk of cross contamination
- Enabling different customer goods to be stored alongside each other with clear distinction on which area is which
- Controlling temperature between storage areas and between different product types
- Storing raw materials and finished goods in one unit
- Odour control

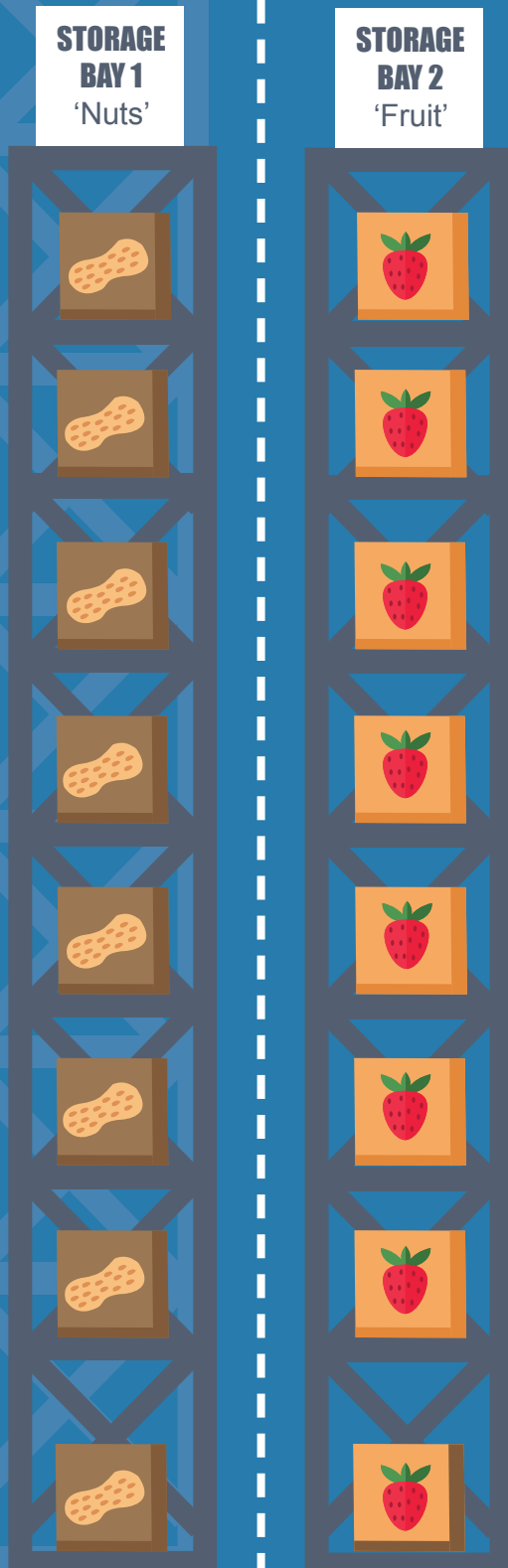


Creating this space, is however alighted with problems such as:

- The height of warehouse buildings
- Needing a versatile, adaptable and yet cost effective solution
- Damage caused by creating permanent partitions in a rented space or investing in a space that is not owned
- Being able to segregate in tight spaces and without losing too much floor space
- Downtime and mess caused during the construction of masonry or stud partitions



The construction of tall masonry or stud partitions can sometimes represent something of a quandary, as there is a structural challenge at high level and as a consequence they can often be used in conjunction with suspended ceilings.



So what's the solution?

**Flexiwall®** is a unique solution made up from reinforced fire-rated PVC and glass cloth panels, which removes many of the usual headaches associated with creating a partition to segregate space:

- Systems can be installed to any height, length or profile and will even fit around existing services
- Panels are suspended using existing steel work, making installations quick and clean and without the need for additional suspended ceilings
- Systems can be reconfigured and relocated should the requirements within the space change
- Installations don't cause excessive mess and disruption to current operations
- Once installed the final partition takes up minimal floor space and can even be installed between existing racking
- Solutions are cost effective and require less planning than traditional methods
